Representative Themes from "Lincoln on Professionalism"

- Honesty increases success because it increases lawyers' and clients' credibility. Judges and jurors recognize dishonesty and find ways to punish it.
- A concern for reputation and one's good name is paramount. Lincoln recognized that a person's character could determine the outcome of a case.
- Basic moral courage and maturity (generally based on a lack of vanity) prevents you from panicking and becoming temperamental in response to real or imagined slights and surprises. A calm, friendly demeanor is more trustworthy than an angry one.
- Respect for other people (including opponents, witnesses and jurors) is recognized by everyone you meet and is rewarded.
